The main objective of library is to provide reading materials and current information to IFS probationers, faculty, In-service IFS officers and staff. Library collection is one of the best collections in the field of forestry, environment, wildlife conservation, Eco-development, and its allied subjects. This library acts as a National Information Centre for forestry, wildlife and environment.

The Library subscribes newspapers (14), magazines (21), Foreign Journals (19), Indian Journals (58) and e-journals (8) published by various national and International organizations/ Institutions. IGNFA Library has a rich collection of digital contents which are placed in IGNFA Website and reading available for the users within the campus.

1. **Digital Archive** contains 163 digitized rare books, regional language books and more than one lakh Photographs, have been uploaded in the website for accessing to the users within the campus.
2. **E-resources** contains all e-journals and OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), National Digital Library(NDL) and shodganga.Portal

Aims & objectives

The library has following **aims**:-

1. To develop, maintain a comprehensive National Collection,
2. To ascertain equitable access of users to the collection in view of enhancing learning capacity and to collect and preserve the intellectual creative printed materials.
3. To collect, organize and disseminate relevant information on forestry, wildlife, environment and its related fields.
4. To cater to literature consultation needs of IFS(P), Faculty, In-service IFS officers, and staff.

On the basis of above aims, IGNFA Library has following **Objectives**: -

The IGNFA Library is mainly responsible for providing information to the official of IFS trainees of various levels and facility with wider resources available in addition to the own resources published from the Academy. The resources developed by the Library are not confined to any individual library requirement. They are also being processed with internationally acclaimed standard tools and make them available online.

LIBRARY SERVICES

The IGNFA Library offers the following services: -

Lending Services: This service is mainly available to the registered members of the library and officers of sister organization under MOEF and Retired IFS Officers. Members are entitled to borrow/renew/reserve the books, compendium, reports, CDs and others resources for a specific period of time.

Current Awareness Service

IGNFA library subscribes 76 Indian & Foreign journals. It compiles periodically and displays a brief on the contents of current journals in the form of a booklet. The Library brings out the various services to enable the readers to update their information.

Browsing and access to e - resources

IGFNA Library provides access to e-resources to its users within the campus as well off the campus.

Reference and Referral Service

Library provides reference services from its own databases and collections according to the nature of query in the field of Environment, Forests, wildlife and its application areas. Trained Professionals are always available to answer queries and to help the readers in locating the requisite information. The reader may also contact on telephone and e-mail for getting information.

Bibliographical Information Service

Bibliographies are provided on a particular topic on demand as well as in anticipation of such demands from its databases.

Reprographic Service

The Services for Photocopying the documents are providing the readers on payment basis. Photocopy of full text articles, selected pages of books and other materials from its collection at nominal charges.

Database Search

Data search is facilitated through in-house database and CD-Rom database maintained in the library.

Press Clipping Services

IGNFA Library provides newspapers clippings from the leading newspapers and magazines related to forestry, Climate Change, environment, Eco-development, pollution control and wildlife conservation and its related fields. In addition to the indexing of newspaper articles, the library also maintains clippings of newspaper articles.

Inter-Library Loan

IGNFA Library maintains close and cordial relation with other libraries in Dehradun. If a document is not available in library, we can borrow it from other local libraries. Efforts are also made to procure the material from other libraries insistent organization under MOEF an inter library loan, if not available in IGNFA Library.

OPAC and Web- OPAC

Online Public Access Catalogue of library collection provided to all the library users. The library OPAC can be accessed through the Internet browser. Library Professionals assists the readers in finding out the references and publications of their interest.

Indexing Services: - The main purpose is to disseminate precise information about scientific articles published in various journals/magazines subscribing in the library regularly.

Other Services: - Display of new arrivals, Display of important news on notice boards.

Facilities: - IGNFA Library is providing different types of facilities to the users. These are given below: -

(i) Library also have good collection of Audio & Video of lectures recordings, documents and regional languages materials.

(ii) E-library is being accessed to a wide variety of electronic resources (online repositories, e-journals sites etc.) where they can get information to assist them in their projects and assignments.

‘Politicians and bureaucrats do not accept the importance of library’

It is very unfortunate that the politicians and bureaucrats of this country are not ready to accept the importance of library. Seventy percent of library related posts in Indian universities are lying vacant either due to bureaucratic hassles or some other reasons.

This was stated by director and head of Kalanidhi Division, Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts, Ramesh C. Gaur. He was speaking at the one-day national workshop on ‘Plagiarism: Its Detection and Avoidance – Beyond Ethics and Integrity’, organised jointly by the Centre for Study of Social Exclusion & Inclusive Policy and department of Library and Information Sciences of MU, at the Court hall here today.

The workshop was chaired by director, CSSEIP, MU, professor Amar Yumnam and department of Library and Information Sciences, MU, professor Th. Purnima Devi was the discussant.

Continuing his deliberation, Ramesh, quoting the then President of India, S. Radhakrishnan said, library is the heart of an educational institution. “It has its importance more particularly in the higher education institutes where rigorous research works are being taken up. Just like a human cannot survive without a functioning heart, a university will decay without a proper library and information system,” he said.

Ramesh, who also officiates many international bodies on documentation and digital archiving, further pointed out to the research scholars of the varsity present in large that in the present era library management system is 70 percent technology. He said, “Without a proper library system, research works are not possible. This applies both to the faculties as well as the research scholars. With the advancement of technology, library system has gone a drastic change, and we need to keep up with the pace.”

He also emphasised that language barrier faced by non-native English speaking people could be one of the factors of plagiarism among many. "At the same time, parents help children in their school home assignment by 'copy-pasting' from the internet. This is also a practice of plagiarism from an early age," he added.

In his presentation, Ramesh pointed out a number of search engines, library and information software, which are mandatory in the university level research work. It may be mentioned that he was responsible for transforming the library system of the Jawaharlal Nehru University, during his tenure as a librarian.

He maintained that internet has replaced library is a misconception, adding that the former is just a gateway to the information system. "Information can't replace the knowledge system. For instance, the popular search engine Google gives access to only 15 percent of the knowledge on web domain. Information provided is unreliable for serious research work," Ramesh said.

On the sidelines of the workshop, speaking to the IFP, Ramesh said, it is unfortunate that the Manipur University is functioning without a librarian or a deputy librarian. "In absence of a librarian, ad hoc arrangement like giving the charge of a librarian to a professor, who is not trained in the field are common. This is a demeaning practice prevalent in most of the Indian universities," he lamented.

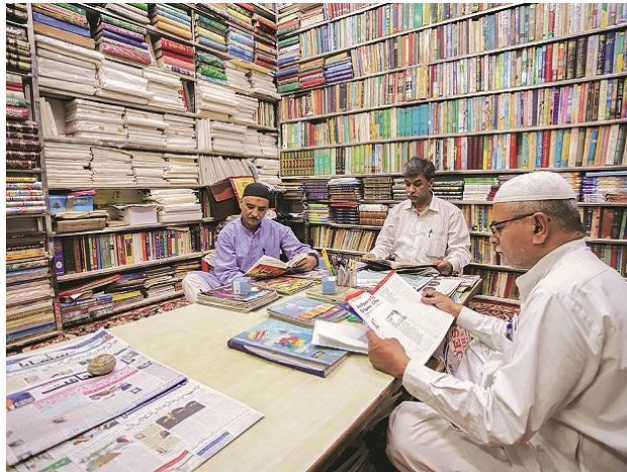
Pointing out that 'indexing of resources' as the foremost function of a library in research work, Ramesh said India as a country, seriously needs to overcome library 'illiterateness' for it to move forward.

He stated that the IGNCAs have been taking up various works in the Northeastern states, adding, more programmes for documentation and archiving are in the pipeline.

Story in numbers: The 'poor' state of public libraries in India IndiaSpend, Business Standard; 30.06.2019

There is one rural library for every 11,500 people, and one urban library for over 80,000 people



The first public libraries Act, the Madras Public [Library](#) Act, was passed in 1948. Its goal was to introduce legal provisions for offering public [library](#) services, for the public and funded by the public. India's public [library](#) movement, which was pioneered by the likes of Maharaja Sayajirao III Gaekwad of Baroda, American library administrator William Alanson Borden, and mathematician and librarian S R Ranganathan, began in the late 19th century. The movement was part of pre-Independence social movements for literacy development that took place in several states, such as Kerala and Andhra Pradesh.

After Independence, there have been a few government initiatives for public libraries, such as the [National](#) Mission on Public Libraries for improving school library services as part of five-year plans for education and assistance, and provision of grants by the Raja Rammohan Roy Library Foundation (RRRLF) for library programmes aimed at training and development. A few public libraries in villages and talukas have also been given financial aid in the construction of buildings and upkeep of facilities. However, these programmes have been ad-hoc and not administered with concerted efforts by the ministry of culture.

There were 70,817 libraries in rural areas and 4,580 in urban areas serving a population of more than 830 million and 370 million, respectively, according to the 2011 census where libraries were notified for the first time. These numbers roughly translate to one rural library for every 11,500 people, and one urban library for over 80,000 people.

However, there is no precise information on the functionality and level of service capabilities of these libraries—the rural libraries could be a room with a few books, while others could be running through the support of private donors or NGOs.

This conference focuses on equitable access of the Government data & Information and the role of Government /Public Libraries for achieving the same.

Objectives

The theme “Equitable Access to Government Information and Data: Role of Government and Public Libraries in South Asia” aims to discuss burning issues about professional and technical aspects of library professionals working in Central Government sector and formulate some recommendations to be placed before the Government of India for the betterment of Library profession in India.

Pre-conference Workshop (17 Oct. 2019)

A pre-conference workshop will be organised on Koha on 17th October, 2019. It is an attempt to strengthen the technical skills of the Koha users so that they can fully exploit the features and troubleshoot typical issues. Live running software needs some typical technical skills to handle the issues so that we can provide uninterrupted service to end users. The proposed topics to be covered during the workshop are as under:

- ☞ Koha Technical difficulties and solutions while installing the Koha;
- ☞ Basics of all modules and handling routine operations;
- ☞ Writing Koha SQL reports as per local requirements;
- ☞ Customization of Koha display;
- ☞ Export and import features of Koha Data migration skill and tools etc.

Guidelines for Paper Submission

1. The abstract in 300-500 words may be submitted on or before 30th July, 2019. The acceptance will be sent by 15th August, 2019.
2. Full paper may be submitted with an abstract in approximately 2500 words, keywords and references on A4 size paper with margin 1cm on all side MS Word format in 12 points New Times Roman type single line spacing. References should be given at the end of the paper under the heading Reference in APA style. Papers should be sent to delhicgla@gmail.com

2. The papers should be based on research surveys; case studies or action plans rather than theoretical explanations. After acceptance, Registration Form and Copyright Declaration Form, downloaded from <http://cgla.org.in> should be submitted electronically at e-mail delhicgla@gmail.com
3. Details such as the name of the author, designation, title of the paper, abstract, name of affiliating institution, mailing address, telephone number, fax number and e-mail address are to be included. The contributors will get intimation regarding the acceptance of the paper by the Editorial Committee for Conference Presentation. All accepted papers will be published in a pre-conference volume with ISBN.
4. The Paper should be accompanied by an amount of Rs.1000/- (Rupees One thousand only) as submission fee, which will be adjusted with Registration Fee.

Once a paper is submitted, no change/modification/addition in authorship will be allowed.

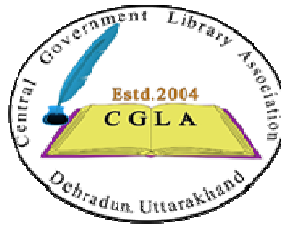

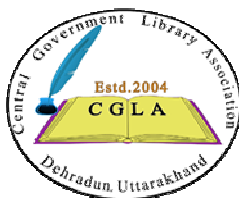
